Proper Attitude (position) in Prayer by E.G. White

I have received letters questioning me in regard to the proper attitude to be taken by a person offering prayer to the Sovereign of the universe. Where have our brethren ob-

tained the idea that they should stand upon their feet when praying to God? One who has been educated for about five years in Battle Creek was asked to lead in prayer before Sister White should speak to the people. But as I beheld him standing upright

upon his feet while his lips were about to open in prayer to God, my soul was stirred within me to give him an open rebuke. Calling him by name, I said, "Get down upon your knees." This is the proper position always.

(Luke 22:41, Acts 9:40, Acts 7:59, 60, Acts 20:36, Acts 21:5, Ezra 9:5,6, Psalms 95:6, and Ephesians 3:14 all quoted.)

I present these proof of texts with the inquiry, "Where did Brother H obtain his education?" - at Battle Creek. Is it possible that with all the light God has given to His people on the subject of

reverence, that ministers, principals, and teachers in our schools, by precept and example, teach young men to stand erect in the devotion as did the Pharisees? Shall we look upon this as significant of their self-

sufficiency and self-importance? Are these traits to become conspicuous?

We hope that our brethren will not manifest less reverence and awe as they approach the only true and living God than the heathen manifest for their idol deities, or these people will be our judges in the day of final decision. I would speak to all who occupy the place of teachers in our schools. Men and women, do not dishonor God by your irreverence and pomposity. Do not stand up in your Pharisaism and offer your prayers to God. Mistrust your own strength. Depend not in it; but often bow down on your knees before God, and worship Him.

10 Ways to Manage your Hay Fever Symptoms

"Hay fever" (seasonal allergic rhinitis) affects over 20% of the people living in the U.S. Most common in early spring, the symptoms of hay fever develop as a reaction to allergens (allergy-causing substances) in the air, most notably to pollens in the early spring. Other examples of airborne allergens include mold spores, dust, and animal dander.

The American Academy of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology (AAAAI) has some useful tips for those who suffer from seasonal allergies:

- 1. Wash bed sheets weekly in hot water.
- 2. Always bathe and wash hair before bedtime (pollen can collect on skin and hair throughout the day).
- 3. Do not hang clothes outside to dry where they can trap pollens.
- 4. Wear a filter mask when moving or working outdoors.
- 5. Avoid peak times for pollen exposure (hot, dry, windy days, usually between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.). Although pollens are usually emitted in early morning, peak times for dissemination are between around 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
 - 6. Be aware of local pollen counts in your area (visit the National Allergy Bureau Web site).
 - 7. Keep windows and car windows closed; use air conditioning in both if possible rather than opening windows.
- 8. Perform a thorough spring cleaning of your home, including replacing heating and A/C filters and cleaning ducts and vents.
- 9. Check bathrooms and other damp areas in your home frequently for mold and mildew, and remove visible mold with nontoxic cleaners.
- 10. Keep pets out of the bedroom and off of furniture, since they may carry pollen if they have been outdoors.





What is Investment?

It's been around in the Adventist Church for more than 100 years. It brings in about \$4 million each year. And some people don't even know what it is. But Sabbath school Investment is coming back to life. Investment was designed for church members who like to see new, innovative projects that have the potential to really make a difference in communities in the interests of the kingdom of God.

Investment offerings go beyond what we regularly and systematically do in our tithes and offerings. The Investment idea starts in the mind of a person who is challenged by the concept of partnership with God—with making an initial "investment" in a project that is dedicated to God through the Sabbath school Investment program. You begin with "seed money" to start a new venture that is dedicated to God. The profits from this project are then contributed to the Investment program in support of new outreach programs.

E a c h year, on a rotating basis, two union conferences in North America are encouraged to select projects in local con-

ferences that are new and interesting enough to spark the support of Investment leaders and church members. All 13 world divisions of the Adventist Church have their own projects. From the funds allocated to the North American Division for Investment, a portion goes to the projects that have been highlighted and advertised throughout the year.
