

Bible Study

In last month's study we looked at evidence that the composite beast in Revelation 13:1, 2 represents the same power as the "little horn" of Daniel chapter 7.

What else do we know about the composite beast? *Revelation 13:3, 10.* Now comparing this with verse 14, we see that it is this same composite beast an image is caused to be made to by the second beast in verse 11. (Please read the whole chapter several times to see what is going on.)

Now which beast has the mark in verses 16 and 17? If we look at chapter 14, verse 11, it seems to indicate that it is the same beast to which an image is made, again the composite beast in Revelation 13: 1, 2. Hence it also must be the mark of the "little horn" of Daniel 7.

Read Revelation 14:9-11

and notice that a very solemn warning is given against receiving this mark. But also notice that in verse 12 we are told how to keep from receiving this mark, whatever it is. Those who, by the faith of

Jesus, persevere in keeping God's commandments (God's law) will not receive the mark! Does this mean that the "mark" has something to do with God's law?

Look at Daniel

7:25 (NKJV). What does the "little horn" think or intend to do? This could not be referring to man's law, which is changed all the time, but to God's law which does not change (see Matthew 5:18). But notice that in attempting to change law he also attempts to change "times". Which commandment is the only one dealing with "times"? Exodus 20:8-11. Notice also that receiving the mark has something to do with worship (Revelation 14:9, 11). Could, therefore, the

mark of the beast have anything to do with worship on Sunday, the first day of the week?

Now notice the following quotations:

"Sunday is our MARK of authority!...The Church is above the Bible, and this transference of Sabbath observance is proof of that fact." – *The Catholic Record, London, Ontario, Canada, 11-1-1923.*

"Of course the Catholic Church claims that the change was her act...AND THE ACT IS A MARK of her ecclesiastical power." – from the office of Cardinal Gibbons, 11-11-1895.

"The Catholic Church...by virtue of her divine mission, changed the day from Saturday to Sunday." – The Catholic Mirror (official organ for Cardinal Gibbons), 9-23-1893.


