Ye shall receive power when the Holy Ghost is come upon you; and ye shall be My witnesses...unto the uttermost part of the earth," said Christ. Acts 1:8

In the same connection He also said, "All power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore." Matthew 28:18

Take these texts in connection with Romans 1:20, which tells us that this power is seen in everything that has been made — in the blade of grass, and in the hosts of the heavens — and see what encouragement it is for all men.

We learn the power by which God works to save us from sin. Every soul who is longing for deliverance may know that "the power that worketh in us" to save, whenever we really desire salvation, is the power that supports and holds together the universe. Then let no one say or think that God cannot save a sinner such

as he is. Nothing is too hard for the Lord.

There is encouragement also to witness to the power of this salvation; for the power that saves is the power by which witnesses are sent forth. Nothing less than all power in heaven and in earth can save a man from sin; so that whoever is saved has all that power with which to proclaim the Word of truth, the Gospel of our salvation.

Notice that what is needed, and all that is promised, for the proclamation of the Gospel, is power. The Lord does not promise eloquence nor learning, but power. Paul was not destitute of that which in the world passes for wisdom, yet he says, "My speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power; that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." 1 Corinthians 2:4,5.

It is power that tells. Not human power, but Divine power. There is no power but of God," so that all attempts to make an impression are vain. "He whom God hath sent, speaketh the words of God" (John 3:34), and "the Word of God is quick, and powerful."

All therefore that is needed for the Gospel to go with power is to have a company of people fully yielded to God's power — that is, to His will— and saved by it. There need not necessarily be many. Twelve such men effected a mighty change in the world a few hundred years ago.

All are not apostles; all are not evangelists; all are not called to go as missionaries to other lands, or even to other neighborhoods, than their own; but each one who is saved can witness to the power of Christ to save, with all the power by which he has been saved.



A second meal should never be eaten until the stomach has had time to rest from the labor of digesting the preceding meal. New Adventist TV Show addresses Church and Social Issues

The Seventh-day Adventist Church is launching a new television show this month, featuring panelists tackling subjects such as the role of women in the church, the influence of media on Christianity, and the relevance of marriage in to-day's society.

The series, titled "Intersection: Your Faith, Your World," will begin airing February 6 on the church's international satellite network, Hope TV. The programs will be available for download at intersection.adventist.org. The show is a series of about 100 episodes which will run Friday nights for two years, with re-runs available at other times of the week.

"The programs aim to explore issues which we all face in society, and as Adventist Christians in our faith community," said Rajmund Dabrowski, executive producer and communication director for the Adventist world church.

The roundtable program, initiated by world church President Jan Paulsen, will cover a range of topics including "Christians in a Culture of Indifference," "Becoming What We Watch," "Does Marriage Still Matter?" "Why Study the Bible?" and "The Art of Forgiveness" and "Christians and Politics."

The program is meant to serve as a starting point for discussions in small groups, Bible studies and Saturday morning classes, said Williams Costa Jr., the church's associate director

for media production.

Dabrowski said the programs will also serve the purpose of introducing viewers unfamiliar with Adventism to the church's perspec tives on issues.

"An exchange of views by experts will provide an open look, we hope, into what we think and how we approach our world as Adventists," he said.

Bettina Krause, senior producer for Intersection, will host the shows. The panels will consist of Adventist commentators, academics and professionals.

many of his problems were self-inflicted, that only made them even harder to bear.

But everything we see in the Twenty-third Psalm indicates that David, notwithstanding all his troubles, found life filled to the brim with God, the Good Shepherd.

The last part of the fifth verse says: "My cup runs over." David's blessings and happiness in the Lord didn't stop at the brim. His cup was so filled that it ran over!

When you're drinking something you enjoy and pass your cup back to ask your host to refill it, do they usually fill it to the brim? Probably not. And why not? Because people filling cups stop a little below the brim, for fear the contents will spill over. But God doesn't care at all if the blessings and happiness He gives us spill over. In fact, He wants them to!

It is one thing to generously and carefully fill our cups of life to the brim. But God has much more in mind for us, so He doesn't stop at the brim. If we let Him do what He wants, He'll fill our cups so full that they'll run over and be a blessing to those about us. Those about us will receive the overflow.

2. From the New Testament

The New Testament tells what it meant for Jesus to die on the cross for us. Commenting on what we find there, Ellen White wrote: "The spotless Son of God hung upon the cross, His flesh lacerated with stripes: those hands so often reached out in blessing, nailed to the wooden bars; those feet so tireless on ministries of love, spiked to the tree: that royal head pierced by the crown of thorns; those quivering lips shaped to the cry of woe. And all that He endured—the blood drops that flowed from His head, His hands, His feet, the agony that racked His frame, and the unutterable anguish that filled His soul at the hiding of His Father's face speaks to each child of humanity, declaring, It is for thee that the Son of God consents to bear this burden of guilt; for thee He spoils the domain of death, and opens the gates of Paradise. He who stilled the angry waves and walked the foamcapped billows, who made devils tremble and disease flee, who opened blind eyes and called forth the dead to life—offers Himself upon the cross as a sacrifice, and this from love to thee" (The Desire of Ages, p. 755).

What wonderful love Jesus has for us! He gave His all that we might have the fullness of joy in Him! He gave all and then was resurrected. The disciples' joy when they saw Jesus again is beyond our comprehension. They could happily report as John did: "And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life" (1 John 5:11, 12).

John suffered much for Christ, but none of that mattered. He had eternal life! What tremendous joy and happiness he received through it all! To have eternal life through Jesus' love and care!

We have that eternal life now in Him. Let's not forget it as we sometimes seem to. It's our privilege to be the happiest people on earth. We need to demonstrate that joy and happiness to all about us. Then we will testify to all that we will "dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Ps. 23:6).
