Fire detectors and their batteries, exciting stuff, huh? Well, we see this kind of stuff in the church as well. At times there is noise in the church that we try to sleep through. Noise about an individual. It could be noise that we are causing about an individual. To avoid the noise about them, we'll try to avoid them, draw conclusions from assumptions, and may even share it with others and add to the noise until the noise becomes a choir having different singers and parts. What is this noise? When we make perceptions reality. What we see isn't always what it seems.

But if we go to the fire detector, then all we have to do is open it and see that it simply needs is a new battery. We could have started cursing the poor fire detector in our prayers, shared our thoughts about it with other members, etc. All the while we fail to realize that the fire detector has a job to do and that's to keep those that are in the house safe. But when there is noise, all we have to do is get up, go up to fire detector, actually see what the problem really is, make a simple change (such as a battery), and then we can all sleep through the night.

Wouldn't it be nice if when we had problems in the church it were as easy as changing a battery rather than talking about people and drawing conclusions about them that are not true? Just a thought.

Read Hebrews 8:6-13.

If the "new" covenant (v.8) was established upon better promises than the "old" covenant (see v. 6), does that mean that God made promises which were faulty when He established the old covenant with Israel? Note that the word "covenant" in v.7 is in italics and hence not in the original Greek text. Therefore the word "first" in v.7 probably refers not only to "covenant" (from v.6), but also to "ministry" and "promises" (also from v.6).

When did God make the old covenant with Israel? (v.9) Therefore, upon what promise (or promises) was the old covenant established? Exodus 24:3,7,8.


Movie Night at SJ Central
